
### Sculpture Garden at the High Museum

### Before you ask, absolutely no one...

### says "Hotlanta."


- **1."ITP"** and **"OTP"**: These abbreviations stand for "Inside the Perimeter" and "Outside the Perimeter," referring to whether a location is within or outside of Interstate 285, which encircles much of Atlanta.
- **2. Bless Your Heart**: While not exclusive to Atlanta, this Southern expression can be used to convey sympathy or understanding in a kind manner.
- **3. Peachtree Street**: It's essential to know that there are many streets in Atlanta with "Peachtree" in their name. Locals might say, "Take a left on Peachtree" without specifying which one, so be sure to clarify!
- **4.The Connector**: This term refers to the stretch of interstate where I-75 and I-85 merge in downtown Atlanta. Locals might say, "I'm stuck on the Connector."
- **5. The Big Chicken**: If someone mentions "The Big Chicken," they're talking about the giant chicken-shaped sign that marks a KFC restaurant in Marietta, a suburb of Atlanta.
- **6. Spaghetti Junction**: This nickname is given to the complex network of highways where I-285 intersects with I-85 on the northeast side of Atlanta.
- **7.The BeltLine**: The Atlanta BeltLine is a former railway corridor that forms a loop around the city, which has been transformed into a network of parks, trails, and public spaces.
- **8.ATLiens**: A term coined by the hip-hop group OutKast to refer to people from Atlanta. Find this 30-foot tall tribute by searching "Outkast mural".

- 1197 Peachtree St NE
- <This Midtown indoor food hall is a thoughtful mix of local and chefdriven stalls that offer a diverse range of cuisince in modern space with a bar in the middle.

### Ponce City Market

- 675 Ponce De Leon Ave NE
- Housed in a rehabbed Sears building in O4W, this popular food hall and retail destination is right off the Eastside Beltline, with resturants offering counter and dine-in service. There's also a rooftop restaurant.

### Chattahoochee Food Works

- With in and outdoor seating in this expansive food and retail space curated by seasoned and celebrity partners, these 31 vendors offer up top talent for your tastebuds in West Midtown.





# Historic Sites

atlanta may have entirely burned down during general sherman's "march to the sea" in 1864, but atlanta's history lives on at these historical sites since it's rebirth as "the gate city of the south."



### Martin Luther King Jr. National Historic Park

 <This National Historic Landmark dedicates several sites all related to the legacy of MLK, which includes his church, boyhood home, and gravesite of him and his wife, Coretta Scott King.

### Oakland Cemetery

 As Atlanta's oldest public park, it is also the final resting place of many of the city's most noted citizens like Margaret Mitchell, Kenny Rogers, Bobby Jones, and Dr. Joseph Jacobs.

### Margaret Mitchell House

 Square in the middle of Midtown on Peachtree Street, this historic home-turned-museum is where this author wrote "Gone with the Wind", a Pulitzer Prize for Fiction book in 1937.

### Ebenezer Baptist Church

 Near the King Center, this church was pivotal to the life and legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., where he was baptized, ordained and served as co-pastor with his father until 1968.

### The Wren's Nest

 This National Historic Landmark is the former home of author and journalist Joel Chandler Harris, a pioneer in the preservation of oral storytelling of African American folklore.
